Dear Friend of Lira:

At last! It is my truly great pleasure to invite you to see Poland with Lira - in the name of the Board of Directors of the Lira Ensemble of Chicago.

After two years of COVID preventing any tours, Lira is offering tours of Southern and Northern Poland. The country is totally safe, despite the war in Ukraine. The millions of Ukrainians that Poland was gracious enough to take in, have settled around the country and are hardly visible. Of course, if there should be any hint of danger, our modern tour bus takes us directly to the nearest airport or to Warsaw for our flight back to the US.

**THIS IS THE YEAR TO SEE POLAND, BECAUSE THE EXCHANGE RATE FOR THE US DOLLAR IS SO BEFICIAL IN RELATION TO THE EURO AND THE POLISH ZLOTY!** You will really get lots for your money.

Despite the fact that prices have gone up all over Europe as well as in Poland, **this year's Southern Tour is only \$173.00 more than Lira's 2020 tour. This year's Northern Tour is \$374.00 LESS than the 2020 Northern Tour** because few Americans visit the North and so prices are lower,

As you may know, the Lira Ensemble is the only professional performing arts company in the US specializing in Polish music, song, and dance. We are a symphony orchestra, singers and dancers, and are artist-in-residence at Loyola University Chicago. Lira is a not-for-profit organization whose mission is to bring the best of Polish culture into American life. Since 1993, Lira has organized tremendously enjoyable, very personal tours of Poland. I am a second-generation tour director, trained by my parents, who were very successful travel agents specializing in Poland.

Lira tours are not the usual kind. We stress personal service, fun, the arts, both folk and high culture as well as architecture and history. We are experts on Poland, so while we show you all the usual attractions, we also go to places unavailable to most tourists. Our trips are like a group of friends visiting Poland, because they attract interesting, like-minded people whose company I am certain you will enjoy. Ours is an exclusive tour; you will not be "bundled" with other groups. These excursions are only for Lira audience members, their families and friends. You do not need be Polish to join us, or to speak Polish - everything is in English and most Poles now speak English.

I go along to provide cultural and historical context. I lead discussions about Poland. I teach you some Polish history, a bit of the Polish language, and a few Polish songs. We introduce you to all kinds of delicious Polish cuisine, in addition to the old favorites you may have loved since you were a child. And we have lots and lots of fun.

These are first class tours, organized by the best travel company in Poland, with a state-of-the-art tour bus and the finest hotels. But Lira does not print fancy, full-color tour brochures and our advertising is mostly word-of-mouth. We use all your money showing you a great time - whatever is left supports our artistic mission. After the tour, when all bills are paid, we will provide you a tax deduction letter - usually about 8% of the tour price.

I lead these tours as a volunteer, because I love showing you my new, beautiful Poland. I hope you can come along this year!

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# 2023 Southern Tour - Trip Itinerary

<b>Thursday</b> June 22	We depart from O'Hare Airport on a LOT Airlines Boeing Dreamliner or any other flight you may want to choose - just be sure to join the tour in Warsaw on Friday morning, June 23rd. If you take LOT, you'll enjoy dinner over the Atlantic. All meals and non-alcoholic drinks onboard are covered by your airfare. Alcoholic beverages are available at reasonable prices. Be sure to bring small bills to pay for them. We nap/sleep or watch a movie or two on your onboard private computer, then have breakfast over Europe. The Dreamliner has lots of electronic "toys" and services, so you may not want to nap. We land at Chopin Airport in Warsaw, Poland's heroic capital city, on Friday.
<b>Friday</b> June 23	Upon arrival in Warsaw, we drive immediately to see the magnificent, restored Royal Castle (because it closes to groups late Friday afternoon). Experts have told us that you will have little or no jet lag if you do not go to sleep upon arrival in Europe, instead spend the day touring and sleep Friday night. We know it works! Plus, you will probably be too excited to sleep. We visit Warsaw's historic Old Town. We enjoy a light lunch in one of Warsaw's fine restaurants. We see a short documentary film about the tragic plight of Warsaw during World War II. Then we stop at the Sofitel Victoria Hotel to freshen up for our evening. Our welcoming dinner is at one of Warsaw's gourmet restaurants. Then we overnight at our hotel. (For those who have visited Warsaw before, Lira offers an alternate itinerary.)
<b>Saturday</b> June 24	We enjoy a breakfast buffet at our hotel, with a large choice of Polish, Continental, and American dishes – which is true of all fine hotels in Poland. After breakfast, we drive down the Royal Route of Warsaw with its many palaces (now often embassies), churches and monuments and see more of the capital city. We visit Wilanow Palace, the summer residence of King Jan III Sobieski, one of Poland's greatest heroes. Lunch is at another of Warsaw's excellent restaurants. After lunch, we tour the POLIN Museum of the History of Polish Jews, Warsaw's newest and most highly praised museums. Next, you will have time to freshen up for dinner at one of Warsaw's premier restaurants. Then we enjoy a private concert of Chopin music at a historic venue in Warsaw; then back to our hotel. If you're not too tired, we recommend a short stroll from our hotel to see a bit of Warsaw Saturday night life on Old Town Square.
<b>Sunday</b> June 25	We attend Mass (if you like) at Holy Cross Church where Chopin's heart is buried, then enjoy breakfast at the hotel before our drive into the countryside to visit Zelazowa Wola, the birthplace of Frederic Chopin. Lunch is at a darling country restaurant. Afterwards, we drive to Lowicz, the Mazovian region known for its colorful paper cutouts and excellent embroidery. We enjoy a folk art presentation and entertainment at the unusual, artistic home of Kasia and Wojtek Gronecki. We tour the ruins of the ancient castle they are restoring. They serve us a homemade, mostly home-grown, dinner in their charming cottage. We drive back to our hotel for the night.
<b>Monday</b> June 26	Breakfast is at the hotel, then we drive southwest to the city of Lodz, Poland's second largest city, once an important industrial center and the home of three cultures: Polish-Catholic, Polish-Jewish and German. We do a short tour of Lodz to see the process of Poland's post-communist recovery and visit the famous Poznanski Palace. Lunch will feature local specialties, then on to the city of Wroclaw, the capital of Lower Silesia. We see Wroclaw's charming Town Square. We have a group dinner reservation at one of the best spots in town, the Cesarsko-Krolewska Restaurant, <b>where you have your first chance to make your own menu choices and pay individually in cash or by credit card.</b> We will help with menu explanations. Then we overnight at the Radisson Blu Hotel.

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<b>Tuesday</b> June 27	Our breakfast at the hotel is also a buffet, which is customary in Poland. Then we tour the city of Wroclaw with its Gothic architecture and Silesian style – different than in other part of Poland. We visit the unbelievable Aula Leopoldina at the University of Wroclaw, decorated in the ultimate Baroque Rococo style. We see the Raclawicka Panorama, the 360-degree painting of the Battle of Raclawice at which Tadeusz Kosciuszko led Polish troops against the Russians – and won the battle. Lunch is at the Malarska Restaurant, with lots of atmosphere, followed by free time for shopping, strolling or resting. <b><i>Dinner is on your own at the restaurant of your choice</i></b> , and there are many choices in charming Wroclaw. You return to the hotel after a lovely evening.
<b>Wednesday</b> June 28	After breakfast at the hotel, we head southeast into the mountains. We stop at the Adoria Vineyard to sample some Polish wine. Vineyards did not exist in Poland before recent climate change in Europe. We stop at the town of Swidnica to see an UNESCO Site, the Church of Peace – one the biggest timber-framed sacred buildings in Europe - with very unusual architecture. Lunch is at a charming restaurant in Swidnica. We continue our drive south through the gorgeous scenery of the foothills and the beautiful Tatra Mountains, part of the Carpathian chain. We arrive at Zakopane for dinner at a wonderful highland restaurant with lots of atmosphere. After dinner, we check into the newly remodeled Bachleda Mercure Kasprowy Hotel.
<b>Thursday</b> June 29	Breakfast is at our hotel, then we tour Zakopane with its distinctive mountaineer architectural style with intricate wood carvings. Zakopane is Poland’s most popular ski resort town, so we go up into the High Tatras in a cable car to see the picturesque panorama of the mountains. <b><i>Lunch is on your own today</i></b> and there is time for resting or shopping in the afternoon. There is much to buy here, especially unique mountaineer folk artifacts. Later, we visit the Orski Gallery of works by Polish-American artist Ryszard Orski. Our hearty dinner is at a Highlanders’ inn with mountaineer decor and folk entertainment. We overnight at the Kasprowy.
<b>Friday</b> June 30	After a good rest in the clean mountain air, we breakfast at the hotel. We drive to a national park for a restful - totally not dangerous - raft ride down the Dunajec River Gorge at the very southern border of Poland. Slovakia is on the other side of the river and we actually enter Slovakian territory - a second country at no extra charge! We enjoy Polish country dishes for lunch at a local inn, then head for Krakow, the beloved capital of southern Poland. We check into the elegant Holiday Inn, which is walking distance from Old Town Square. Since we have had a long bus ride, our superb dinner is at our hotel.
<b>Saturday</b> July 1	Breakfast is at the hotel, then we tour scenic Krakow, the capital of Malopolska (Little Poland - the heartland). Conde Nast Traveler Magazine calls it “the most European of all cities.” We see Wawel Castle and Cathedral, St. Mary’s Church, Old Town Square, the Sukiennice (an historic shopping mall) and much more. <b><i>Lunch is on your own</i></b> , followed by lots of free time for shopping or anything you want to do. Krakow <b>is</b> the best city to shop in. We dine at the Wentzl Restaurant - one of the most elegant in town. Be sure to spend some time in the Old Town Square after dinner. It is fun on a Saturday night. Then we overnight at the Holiday Inn.

<b>Sunday</b> July 2	Breakfast at the hotel, then we drive to Wadowice, the birthplace of Pope John Paul II and tour the excellent new museum dedicated to his life and accomplishments. We attend Mass (if you like) at the basilica where St. John Paul II was baptized and served as an altar boy. After a country lunch, we drive to Auschwitz-Birkenau, the Nazi German concentration camp - an unforgettable experience – a must see. It is an extremely tragic but important part of Polish history. Back in Krakow, we drive through the city's former Jewish district, Kazimierz, with several interesting Jewish restaurants featuring terrific klezmer music. Since <b>dinner is on your own</b> , we can make a reservation for you in Kazimierz or elsewhere in Krakow. We overnight at the Holiday Inn.
<b>Monday</b> July 3	We rise early for breakfast at the hotel before our drive west to Czestochowa, the spiritual capital of Poland. We see the miraculous, historic painting of Our Lady and tour the monastery on the Mount of Light. We will have the opportunity to request Masses for your loved ones to be celebrated at the foot of the painting, and a chance to buy religious souvenirs at Czestochowa. We lunch at the enchanting small palace in Czarny Las. We drive back to Krakow to Lagiewniki, the new Sanctuary of Divine Mercy, founded by one of Poland's newer saints, Sister Faustina. We see the acclaimed St. John Paul II Center. <b>Dinner is on your own</b> before overnighing at our hotel.
<b>Tuesday</b> July 4	After breakfast at our hotel, we visit the Sukiennice Gallery of spectacular, 19 <sup>th</sup> century Polish art. Next, we see Krakow's newest attraction – the Underground Route under Old Town Square – a great way to learn about the history of this fantastic city. <b>Lunch is on your own</b> . We can recommend many great restaurants - or how about eating under an umbrella in Old Town Square. The food is very good and it's not expensive. What's more, it is the Krakow thing to do. Don't be afraid of the street food and the street vendors; they are perfectly safe. The afternoon is yours - free time for shopping or anything! For our 4 <sup>th</sup> of July celebration, at have made a reservation at what may be the world's oldest restaurant, Wierzynek, a Krakow tradition, <b>where you can choose from their resplendent menu and each pay our own bill</b> . We overnight at the Holiday Inn.
<b>Wednesday</b> July 5	Since you have been very good travelers and very busy, we offer you all the morning off. You can sleep in and have a leisurely late breakfast, do some final shopping, or start packing, or do anything else that makes you happy. <b>Lunch is on your own</b> . We get together in the afternoon to visit the famous. unusual church in suburban Nowa Huta that launched St. John Paul II's career. In the early evening, we tour the remarkable Wieliczka Salt Mine – which has to be seen to be believed. Our elegant farewell dinner is in one of the salt chambers – a very unusual, enjoyable experience. We enjoy Cracovian folk song and dance and then return to the Holiday Inn.
<b>Thursday</b> July 6	Do have a big breakfast, because this will be one of the longest days of your life, due to your trans-Atlantic flight. If you fly with the group, we must be at Krakow's John Paul II Airport early for our flight to Warsaw, where we catch our flight to Chicago. Since your bags have been checked through to Chicago, your hands are fairly free. If there is time, try to do a bit of duty-free airport shopping at Krakow or Warsaw Airport, which is recommended. On our flight home, lunch and a small snack will be served on board, as are soft drinks, coffee and tea. Alcoholic drinks may be purchased in US or Polish small bills. Our flight will take about 10 hours, but when we arrive in Chicago, it will be Thursday afternoon.

### Tour prices and important notes

- **\$4,848.00** base charge per person, two to a room, departing from Chicago.  
This price is for a group of 15. If fewer than fifteen people sign up for this tour, the price will be somewhat higher.
- Lira prices are closely tied to the value of the dollar abroad; if it falls steeply, there may be an additional charge.
- **\$775.00** extra charge for a single room.
- We will purchase your airline ticket if you like, but not before we have a group of 15.  
The sooner we have 15, the better, because airfares are higher closer to the departure date.  
**Register for this tour as soon as possible; you will save considerably on your airfare.**
- The first deposit of **\$2,000.00** is due as soon as possible upon registration.
- A second payment of **\$2,000.00** on April 1, 2023.
- **The balance is due on May 1, 2023.**
- **Tour payments must be made by check only.** Sorry, no credit cards.
- Once you've decided to join us, be certain to discuss **TRAVEL INSURANCE** with the Lira Office. The Lira Ensemble recommends that, despite the cost, you DO purchase travel insurance. You have a choice of which company, but Lira will need some information from you about what every plan you purchase before departure – just in case.
- **U.S. and Canadian citizens need only a valid passport to visit Poland; no visa is required. If you do not have a valid passport, please apply for one as soon as possible** - the closer to summer, the longer the lines at the passport office and the longer it takes to get your passport.
- **IMPORANT: Your passport expiration date must be at least six months after your return to the United States.**
- **You may also upgrade your seat** from Economy Class to Premium Economy or Business Class (the LOT equivalent of First Class). **If we have 15 people registered soon, the current Premium Economy fare is very reasonable, and we recommend it – for comfort and special service in the air.**
- A portion of the tour price is deductible from your federal taxes.  
A tax receipt will be issued after the tour, once all bills are paid.

*You can arrive in Poland before the tour, and/or remain in Poland after the tour. Lira can help arrange **HOTELS, TRANSPORTATION** and **TOURS** for your extended stay. If you want to find your family, your ancestral city, town or village in Poland, Lira can suggest a trusted specialist in Poland with excellent English.*

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## **2023 Southern Tour – Terms and Conditions**

**HOTELS:** Twin-bedded or double-bedded rooms with bath or shower in first class or deluxe hotels. A limited number of single rooms are available at the supplementary charge. Hotels are subject to change.

**TIPS & TAXES:** Service charges, as imposed by hotels and taxes by local administrations and government authorities on accommodations, meals, and transportation, are included. Tips to local guides and baggage handlers at the airport and at hotels are included. It is customary for tour members to tip the tour guide (“pilot”) and bus driver who travel with the tour, on the last day of the tour. These tips are not included.

**SIGHTSEEING & TRANSFERS:** Sightseeing is as specified in the itinerary, including entrance fees, and subject to change. Transfer upon arrival and departure overseas by motor coach between airport and hotel and vice versa if traveling with the tour group.

**RESERVATIONS & PAYMENT:** A deposit of \$2,000.00 per person is required at the time of booking. A second installment of \$2,000.00 is due April 1, 2023 and the balance is due on May 1, 2023. ***Reservations and payments are accepted with personal or bank checks only. Sorry, credit cards are not accepted for tour deposits or payments.***

**TRIP CANCELLATION, BAGGAGE AND MEDICAL INSURANCE:** It is advisable to purchase insurance coverage for cancellation or emergency evacuation due to illness or accident. Applications for suggested insurance as well as baggage and travel insurance will be provided once tour deposits are received.

**CANCELLATION AND REFUNDS:** Cancellations must be in writing. Cancellation charges will apply: *Within 90 days prior to departure - 30% of the cost; within 60 days prior to departure - 50% of the cost; within 30 days prior to departure – no refunds.*

**YOUR RATE DOES NOT INCLUDE:** Passport fees, taxes or tips on services not included in the itinerary; laundry or valet service; excess baggage charges; insurance of any kind; wines, beers, liquors or any food or beverages not on regular menus of included meals.

**TRAVEL DOCUMENTS:** A valid passport is required for all U.S. and Canadian citizens traveling to Poland. ***Your passport expiration date must be at least six months after your return date to the US.***

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# 2023 Northern Tour - Trip Itinerary

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**Thursday**  
July 13

If you fly with the tour, we depart from O'Hare Airport on a LOT Airlines Boeing Dreamliner. You may choose any other flight. Just be sure to join the tour in Warsaw on Friday morning, July 14th. If you take LOT, you'll enjoy dinner over the Atlantic. All meals and all non-alcoholic refreshments onboard are covered in your tour price. Alcohol is also available at reasonable prices. Bring small bills to purchase such drinks. We nap/sleep or watch a movie or two on your onboard private computer, then have breakfast over Europe. The Dreamliner has lots of electronic "toys" and services, so you may be tempted not to sleep. We land at Chopin Airport in Warsaw, Poland's dauntless capital city, on Friday morning.

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**Friday**  
July 14

Upon our arrival in Warsaw, we board our state of the art tour bus, and tour the magnificent, restored Royal Castle. Meanwhile, our bags are taken to our hotel – the Sofitel Victoria, one of Warsaw's best. (For those who have been to Warsaw, we can offer an alternate itinerary if you like. However, you may want to see the Castle again, because there is so much to see and sometimes they open new rooms.) After a light lunch, we tour Warsaw's Old Town. We view a brief film about the tragic history of Warsaw during World War Two. You will have a chance to change for our evening events. We attend a private concert of Chopin piano music in one of Warsaw's many palaces. Our welcoming dinner is at an elite Warsaw restaurant. Then we overnight at our hotel.

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**Saturday**  
July 15

We enjoy a breakfast buffet at our hotel, with a large choice of Polish, continental, and American dishes. We drive the Royal Route of Warsaw, passing many palaces (now often embassies), churches and monuments, and see more of the capital city. We arrive at Wilanow, known as the Polish Versailles, and tour this summer residence of King Jan III Sobieski (one of Poland's great heroes). (For those who have seen Wilanow, we can suggest an alternate itinerary, such as the unique Warsaw Uprising Museum.) We lunch at a fine local restaurant, after which we visit one of Warsaw's newest attractions, the Polin Museum of the History of Polish Jews – a highly recommended, remarkable experience. We have dinner at another of Warsaw's exquisite restaurants. Since it is Saturday night, a walk through Old Town is a great idea to see how Poles enjoy the weekend before you return to our hotel.

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**Sunday**  
July 16

We attend Mass (if you like) at Holy Cross Church where Chopin's heart is buried or another of Warsaw's historic churches if you have already seen the Holy Cross Church. Then back to our hotel for breakfast. Next, we visit the National Museum of Art to view some of Poland's most treasured paintings. Then we leave Warsaw, driving northeast into the countryside. We lunch at a charming country inn, then continue our drive east to the town of Bialowieza and check into the rustic Zubrowka Hotel. We enjoy dinner at the unique Carska (Czar's) Restaurant. After dinner, Lucyna offers a quick review of Polish history over a snifter of French cognac (or whatever you wish, so you can better understand what you are seeing).

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**Monday**  
July 17

After breakfast at our hotel, we tour the world famous Bialowieza National Park, which includes one of last primeval forests in Europe and is included in the UNESCO list of World Natural Heritage Sites. A walk through this silent, haunting woodland is refreshing and memorable. We see the zubry – Poland's buffalos – and other exotic animals native only to Poland. We enjoy a picnic lunch near the forest, then drive to the village of Hajnowka to visit the Orthodox Church there to learn about Poland's surprising religious diversity. Later, dinner at our hotel includes an introduction to Zubrowka, the delicious vodka created in this region.

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<b>Tuesday</b> July 18	Following breakfast at the hotel, we drive northwest through Poland's beautiful and unspoiled glacial lake region. We stop to see the historic synagogue at Tykocin. Lunch is at an unforgettable wooden country inn. Then we drive to the renowned city of Bialystok to see the Branicki Palace. We drive on to the city of Olsztyn, where we check-in to a local spa or hotel. (I could not get a confirmation and I did not want to delay sending this information to you. However, I assure you, the hotel will be up to your standards.) Dinner is at the hotel, and we recommend an evening walk around this peaceful, pleasant area.
<b>Wednesday</b> July 19	Breakfast is at the hotel, then we continue driving through the "Land of a Thousand Lakes." We stop at Sw. Lipka – a gorgeous Baroque church surprisingly situated in the middle of Poland's least populated region. Lunch is at a homey, country restaurant. We drive further west, weaving through beautiful lakes and forests, to the Tri-City of Gdansk/Sopot/Gdynia. Dinner is at one of Gdansk's finest restaurants in a city known for its good food. Our hotel is the brand new, luxurious Granary Island Holiday Inn.
<b>Thursday</b> July 20	After breakfast at the hotel, we tour the seaport city of Gdansk with its unique late Renaissance and Baroque architecture and interesting history. Gdansk was a member of the historic Hanseatic League – an important economic alliance between several European cities during the Middle Ages – so it has a very prosperous past. <b>Lunch is on your own</b> , and there are many delightful restaurants to choose from, followed by some free time for shopping, strolling or resting. Later in the day, we visit the new Museum of the Second World War. We dine together at another famous restaurant in Gdansk and return back to Granary Island.
<b>Friday</b> July 21	After our breakfast buffet at the hotel, we visit the new European Solidarity Center – Gdansk is the home of the Solidarity Movement that freed Poland and eventually nearly all of Central and Eastern Europe of communism. And then free time for shopping or plans of your own. We gather for lunch at another Gdansk spot. Afterwards to Gdynia, the second of the Tri-City towns, for a short visit. In the early evening, we drive to the last Tri-City of Sopot, which is a renowned sea resort and home to the longest wooden pier in Europe. There we dine beautifully, then drive back to Granary Island.
<b>Saturday</b> July 22	After breakfast at the hotel, we drive to Malbork Castle, the former seat of the Order of Teutonic Knights. We tour this huge, imposing, and very interesting fortress, then enjoy lunch in the castle complex. We drive into the heart of the Kaszubian Region of Poland to visit an outdoor Ethnographic Park with an authentic, historic Kaszubian village. We drive to town of Zukowo for a classic Kaszubian meal with folk songs and dances and an opportunity to purchase beautiful Kaszubian folk crafts. Then back to the hotel.
<b>Sunday</b> July 23	We attend early Mass at St. Brygida Church (if you like) – which became famous as the Solidarity church. Then breakfast at the hotel and we drive to Torun, home town of Nicholas Copernicus, the great Polish astronomer. Torun is also home of Polish gingerbread, which you can munch on as we make a short tour of this lovely, historic town. Torun's Old Town is on the UNESCO list of world treasures. Several Polish cities made the list. You will have time for shopping and/or <b>lunch on your own</b> and there are many cute spots. Then we drive to Gniezno, the first capital of Poland, with its Gothic Cathedral with bronze doors that date back to the 12 <sup>th</sup> century - the best example of Romanesque art in Europe. We continue on to Poznan, one of the major cities in Poland, a business center that is the capital of Greater Poland. We check into the Sheraton Hotel. Our dinner includes local treats, then back to the hotel for the night.

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**Monday**  
July 24

After breakfast at the hotel, we tour Poznan, including its Renaissance Town Hall and bustling town square. We'll watch the Poznan goats butt heads at the strike of noon - an old tradition. We see an example of how Poland is updating without losing its heritage – a modern shopping mall in an historic brewery. Then, free time for shopping/resting/private touring followed by ***lunch on your own***. You have been very good travelers, so you deserve a night off. There are many restaurants to choose from for ***dinner on your own***. You may want to dine in the open air on the square. It is not expensive and quite good. And people watching is fun. We overnight at the Sheraton.

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**Tuesday**  
July 25

Breakfast is at the hotel before we drive east to Lichen, called the “Czestochowa of the North” because it has become a major place of pilgrimage. Its huge basilica was built as Poland's thanks to the Blessed Virgin for freeing the country of communism. We drive toward Warsaw, stopping at Zelazowa Wola, the birthplace of Frederick Chopin. We lunch at an adorable country inn and then drive to the suburbs of Warsaw, to the Mazurka Hotel where a farewell dinner awaits us with a last taste of Polish folklore. Do get a good night's sleep before your return flight.

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**Wednesday**  
July 26

Today is one of the longest days of your life, because of your trans-Atlantic flight. After breakfast at our hotel, we drive to the Chopin Airport. There will be an opportunity to do some shopping at the duty-free shops and it is recommended. As before, all food and non- alcoholic drinks onboard your flight are included in your ticket price. You may use US or Polish small bills to pay for alcoholic beverages. When you arrive in Chicago, it will be 10 hours later, but it will still be Wednesday afternoon.

- **IMPORANT: Your passport expiration date must be at least six months after your return to the United States.**
- **You may also upgrade your seat** from Economy Class to Premium Economy or Business Class (the LOT equivalent of First Class). **If we have 15 people registered soon, the current Premium Economy fare is very reasonable and we recommend it – for comfort and special service in the air.**
- A portion of the tour price is deductible from your federal taxes.  
A tax receipt will be issued after the tour, once all bills are paid.

**HOTELS:** Twin-bedded or double-bedded rooms with bath or shower in first class or deluxe hotels. A limited number of single rooms are available at the supplementary charge. Hotels are subject to change.
